Richard Fredrick Wallschlaeger Mead was born in 1930 at Hollywood Hospital in Los Angeles to Fritz Oscar Wallschlaeger and Dorothy Mae Hosfeldt Wallschlaeger. He had three sisters, Suzie Curtis, Linda Wallschlaeger (who proceeded him



in death), and Anita Minard. After doing a stint in the US



Army during the Korean Conflict, Dick attended the University of Hawaii and San Jose State, before finally graduating from UC Berkeley.

n 1961, Richard married Judith Snow, who was to become his

wife of 39 years – preceding him in death in 2000. Together, Richard and Judith raised three children, Kristy Reardan, Rick Mead, and Sandy Veit, living 41 of those years in Moraga. He worked for 33 years for Pacific Telephone and Telegraph.



Kichard enjoyed visiting with other cabin owners in the mountain community of Soda Springs, where he owned a cabin for 31 years. He volunteered at the Contact Care Crisis Help line, drove a



shuttle bus to church and was a member of SIRS. Richard enjoyed playing poker, bridge, and cribbage. He also loved keeping in contact with his three dearest kindergarten friends, his fraternity brothers of Delta Sig, and

his family. Richard loved God and strove to instil a love of the Lord within and outside his family.
